

Always a step ahead: Spewe joins the battery pack system CAS

CAS cross-brand battery pack system

Spewe develops and produces insulation cutting equipment and special tools for the insulation processing industry. Now the Swiss company is the 25th partner to bring a total of ten battery-based machines into the cross-brand Cordless Alliance System (CAS). This brings the CAS portfolio to 280 machines.

Nürtingen/Schwaderloch, September 2021: When it comes to powerful cutting tools for insulating material and special tools for the construction trade processing insulating material, many professional users rely on Spewe. The Swiss company with headquarters in Schwaderloch is now part of the Cordless Alliance System (CAS). "We want that our customers are always at the top. As part from CAS we can offer them even more. Thanks to CAS they have access to more than 280 machines from highly specialised manufacturers. One battery pack fits every tool, which is very important on a construction site", says Daniel Muntwyler, managing director at Spewe. The Swiss company adds a total of eight hot wire cutting machines and two all-purpose cutting tools on battery pack basis to the cross-brand battery pack appliance initiated by Metabo. "With CAS we now have a powerful battery pack technology, which provides our tools with the required power. A lot of energy is required to heat a hot wire. To spare users having to replace the battery pack already after a short while, we need battery packs with a long runtime and high power output. CAS provided us with this", explains Muntwyler. Even Metabo CEO Henning Jansen is happy about the latest CAS addition: "Spewe is a great benefit to us. We have been in contact for a while and we are happy that we managed to gain a new powerful partner, who helps us advance in the facade construction area."







A cut above in facade construction

The new machines are the ideal complement to the CAS range especially for painters, plasterers and those working with stucco or more commonly known outside of Germany as render, says Muntwyler. "The CAS range offers tools for every workstep. The user can cut insulating material with the Spewe cordless hot wire cutting tool or with our cordless multi-purpose cutting tool with inserted Metabo saw. He can then mix the adhesive with the Collomix cordless hand-held stirrer and insulation panels are dowelled with the Metabo cordless hammer. If the panels then need to be sanded, the user uses the cordless sanding tools from Rokamat. All these machines work with one and the same battery pack." Furthermore, the Spewe machines are used for cutting floor insulation or wood fibre panels. Plumbers and roofers also use the tools of the Swiss company, for example, to cut flat roof insulation and general roof insulation." All in all this means: One scope of application, the matching machines for every workstep and only one battery pack", says Muntwyler.

Precise cuts, flexible working

Using the new cordless hot wire cutting tools and cordless multi-purpose cutting tools from Spewe, users can cut insulating panels in a precise and time-saving manner. The hot wire cutting tools are available in different versions. From mineral wool panels, EPS or XPS panels to cork and cellular glass - the Spewe tools cut different materials and are suited for varied applications high up on the scaffolding, in the workshop or on the construction site. The cordless hot wire tools have an energy saving function that prevents that the wire gets heated along its entire length. Thanks to this, significantly more cuts can be made with one battery pack charge.
